

Skot Butler is President of Intelsat General Communications, LLC (IGC), the US & Allied Government-focused subsidiary of Intelsat, the world's largest commercial communications satellite owner-operator. He is responsible for ensuring that the company's customers receive resilient and secure solutions and employees remain vigilant and focused on the user mission.

Skot has played key leadership roles at IGC for over a decade, most recently as Vice President of Satellite Networks and Space Services. Previously he led the company's corporate strategy and business development efforts--ranging innovative satellite-based services to hosted



payloads. In 2009, Skot was instrumental in securing the premier commercially hosted government payload. The contract is with the Australian Defence Force for a UHF payload on Intelsat 22, which launched in 2012. The Australian Defense Minister then estimated the 15-year program achieves savings of \$150M over a dedicated system.

Skot has been a leading industry proponent for the inclusion of commercial satellite capabilities as a foundational element of the U.S. government's future space architecture to help ensure assured access to the latest in affordable satellite technologies, while meeting mission assurance requirements. He is a regular speaker at industry and government forums.

Prior to joining Intelsat General, Skot led strategy and business development at DRS Spacelink's satellite services business line and for Verestar where he was a founding member of the company's government services unit.

Skot holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the University of Maryland, College Park. He is a past board member of the Washington Space Business Roundtable and the Board of the Future Space Leaders Foundation. Under Skot's leadership, IGC provides financial and volunteer support to the Patriot foundation whose mission is to provide support for the families of Airborne, Air Assault and Special Operations soldiers, and other selected warriors killed, wounded, injured, or ill in the Global War on Terrorism. Skot volunteers at Boulder Crest Retreat, which offers wounded warriors and their families a comfortable retreat during recovery from injuries sustained in service.
